Please find some personal and professional information below, for your review. The experiences noted in this bio have aided me in being able to improve business practices, establish strategic planning processes, manage and grow large organizations, and establish effective leadership initiatives throughout my career.

1. Selected as the Outstanding Student Teacher at Indiana University and represented Indiana University at an educational leadership symposium, as a reward for outstanding performance and achievement.
2. Cited in the U.S. Senate Record for forming and being elected Commander of the only campus based chapter of the Disabled American Veterans in the United States in history, and for activism in initiating a movement to make the campus at Indiana University, Bloomington, IN, more accessible for all handicapped students.
3. Selected by then Indiana Governor Otis R. Bowen [future Secretary of HHS in the Reagan Administration] to serve on a select committee for the State of Indiana for the Employment of the Handicapped [Chaired by L. Keith Bulen, future Reagan Administration White House appointee].
4. Selected by Brigadier General Emmett Bean to serve on the Commanding General's Advisory Council at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indianapolis, Indiana.
5. Selected by U.S. Army Chief of Staff, General Creighton Abrams to serve on the national Army Chief of Staff's Advisory Council, Washington, DC. I was [and still remain] the youngest person in history [age 26] to be chosen for this honor. This was a four [4] year appointment.

7. Met with Army Chief of Staff, General Frederick Weyand, at the Pentagon to discuss military retiree and dependent issues.
8. Met with Secretary of the Army, Martin Hoffman, at the Pentagon to discuss military retiree issues.
9. Met with U.S. Senator Birch Bayh and his administrative aide Darry Sragow, to discuss military matters and veterans' issues [i.e., health care, education, readjustment, vocational rehab, employment, etc.].

11. Met with U.S. Senator Richard Lugar and his administrative aide Mitch Daniels [later to become Director of the Federal OMB and Governor of Indiana] to discuss military retiree issues.

13. Indiana Football Hall of Fame, elected to 4-year term on Board of Directors, Richmond, Indiana.

15. Founder and First President, Iowa Chapter of the Indiana University Alumni Association.

17. Selected as the Outstanding Indiana University Alumnus, Louisville/Southern Indiana Chapter, and submitted as a candidate for Outstanding Member of the national IU Alumni Association.

21. 2000-Picked to be United States delegate to the World Veterans Federation conference, Paris, France. Attended meetings at the United Nations UNESCO building, met with French Prime Minister for

dinner; met with the Mayor of Paris for lunch; met with the French Minister of Defense at the Hotel De Invaldes; and met with the President of the French Senate for breakfast.

35. 2006-Candidate for U.S. House of Representatives [Withdrew prior to primary election due to other commitments in veterans' organization affairs.]
36. 2006 [November]-Selected to be Chairman of the MOPH Foundation's Investment Committee. This committee invests and manages \$34,000,000 in funds for its non-profit foundation that gives grants to combat wounded veterans to assist them in overcoming their injuries and regaining quality of life.
